I. By Birth

- We ourselves are Jews by birth and not ‘Gentile sinners’
 - The Circumcision Group was very _____
 - We are _____ and you are unclean
 - We are circumcised and you are uncircumcised
 - We eat kosher food with Jews and you eat _____ food sacrificed to idols with Gentile sinners

II. By Observing the Law

- “*Works of the law*” means **any human _____ to be justified by God by obeying a moral law**
 - The law cannot save you! The law _____ your sin.
 - You are a sinner and it’s impossible for you to do any _____ work.
 - You are an evil tree, and therefore all that you think, speak, or do, is _____ God.
Jesus says, “*Do people pick grapes from thornbushes, or figs from thistles?*”
You cannot therefore deserve grace by your works.
Since you are a _____ tree, you can only produce _____ fruit, that is to say, sins.
“*For everything that does not come from faith is sin.*” (Romans 14:23)

“*A person is not justified by _____ of the law but through _____ in Jesus Christ...because by works of the law no one will be justified.*” (Galatians 2:16)

- The circumcision group were Jewish teachers who believed that Jesus was the Messiah, the Son of God, but you also have to obey the works of the law. (Cleanliness laws, dietary laws, circumcised)

Two Different Orders

1. Ordinary Religious approach says: You obey in order to be _____
2. The Gospel order says: You’re saved, loved and fully accepted by God; therefore you _____

Both include obedience to God but the _____ is radically different

- In the religious order, your obedience is anxious and selfish
 - You’ll always be _____ because you’re never quite sure whether you are good enough
 - Your good works are motivated by love for yourself, rather than love for God and others
 - It’s a _____ because you have to obey even though you don’t want to

- **Martin Luther struggled with the truth of Justification by Faith!**

Everything changed when he finally understood Romans 1:17

“For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, ‘The just shall live by faith.’”

This _____ grasps Christ's righteousness and appropriates it for itself in the believer's heart.

Once Luther understood this truth, it changed him and became the cry of the Protestant Reformation!

“A Christian is not one who has no sin, but one to whom God imputes not his sin, through faith in Christ. That is why we so often repeat and beat into your minds, the forgiveness of sins and imputation of righteousness for Christ's sake. Therefore, when the law accuses him and terrifies him, he looks up to Christ, and when he has apprehended Him by faith, he has present with him the Conqueror of the law, sin, death and the devil: and Christ reigns and rules over them, so that they cannot hurt the Christian.”

(Martin Luther, *Commentary on Galatians*, 96)
